A new beginning for Kate

The well-being and safety of our members is our top priority, and for some members, being able to trust their staff enough to confide in them their current situation can make all the difference. For one member. Kate, revealing that she and her mom had been living out of their car and sleeping outside under bushes led to connections that provided a safe, stable living arrangement until they could get back on their feet. Upon learning Kate and her

mom were experiencing homelessness, we referred them to our ARCHES program. Within a few days, the family was placed in a shelter, giving both mom and Kate a room and bed to return to each night. Kate continued to attend the Club, making friends with fellow members and showcasing her drawing abilities. By attending the Club, Kate's mom could pick up extra hours at work, knowing that Kate was safe and able to be a kid.

Kate's trust in her staff, the staff's determination to advocate for the member's needs, and BGCGG's network of resources demonstrate our programs' impact in ensuring those who need us most are reached.

Truancy Reduction Program Expands Services

Since 1993, we have been providing truancy reduction services in partnership with Garden Grove Unified School District. In 2021, we expanded our services in partnership with Orange County Department of Education to provide truancy mediation services across Orange County. Services include: psychoeducation, counseling, wellness checks with parents, parent empowerment classes, teen groups, and intensive case management. This

expansion has allowed us to support youth and school districts as they navigate absenteeism.

One out of 10 students misses nearly a month of school every year. When a student misses 10% or more of the school year (excused or unexcused) this can translate into students having difficulty learning to read by the 3rd grade, under achieving in middle school, and not graduating from high school. Our goal is to eliminate and reduce barriers to a student's academic success. COVID-19 highlighted the importance of meeting clients where they are. As a result, we added virtual services. individualized parenting sessions, expanded evening and weekend hours, and technology support to ensure we are reaching the families who need us most. The inclusion of telehealth services allowed more families to participate by removing transportation concerns, allowing them to still go to work, and most importantly playing an active role in their child's academic success.

Family Engagement and Absenteeism

Salvador B. is a single parent of five boys ages 6-16. He was referred for truancy mediation from Irvine Unified School District. The family had experienced complex trauma. Salvador and his children had multiple barriers to attending school. Through intensive case management, we were able to help with the root cause of the absenteeism. Our team supporting the family was able to connect the

entire family with long-term counseling, groceries, time management skills, agendas, and bicycles. All five children improved their attendance and grades. Salvador stated, "The support of Boys & Girls Clubs was the best gift especially during the holidays" and thanked us for checking in on his children and motivating them to continue succeeding in school.



California law places the responsibility on parents to get their kids to school, and there can be legal consequences when they don't. Our goal is to work with the family to address these issues before legal intervention is needed.

Consistency is essential to their healthy development, and each of us uniquely contributes to support and mentor our Club members.

This past year definitely taught my team how much we could achieve under challenging circumstances. Regardless of all the changes and challenges that took place daily, this team is willing to be here for our members and their families! Our mottos are "If there is a will, there is a way" and "teamwork makes the dream work!"

has three dedicated preschool locations, including our new 0-5 program in partnership with Orange County Head Start. This new location will open Spring 2022 and is a full day infant toddler program on the Garden Grove Unified School District Clinton Corner Campus.

Our Early Childcare Programs provide an environment for children to explore, and gain a sense of independence and self-confidence. Our educators work collaboratively with families to provide rich

and engaging learning experiences in a safe, nurturing environment to help children reach their full potential. Supported by Early Learning educators, children learn and discover each day through their own exploration with learning activities. We ensure our children feel safe and loved by taking the time to talk and actively listening to them. Each child is a unique individual who is filled with wonder, and we understand the importance of building strong partnerships with families to support the individual child's optimal development.

Main Branch Renovation

In 1956, a group of community leaders officially established a foundation using funds generously donated by Emlen W. Hoag to provide the necessary resources for the first Boys Club in Garden Grove. As visionaries of their time, the Hoag Trustees wanted to ensure the positive future of the community by providing children a safe place to go after school. On December 27, 1956, their dreams came to fruition with the grand opening of our Main Branch facility located at 9860 Larson Avenue. Over sixty-five years later and Boys & Girls Clubs of Garden Grove has expanded its reach to provide daily programs and services to youth and their families across more than 67 locations.

At the start of the pandemic in March 2020, we temporarily closed our Main Branch location, but as luck would have it, this turned out to be the perfect time to complete some much-needed repairs to the facility. Through the support of the Hoag Foundation and City

Leadership, an agreement was formed in 2017 with the Pacific Companies who serves as the real estate developer for the soon to be opened Garden Brook Senior Village. Along with the creation of an Intergenerational Program plan to benefit both residents and Club members alike, several in-kind building improvements were pledged at the time and in late spring of 2020, Main Branch underwent major renovations including a brand-new roof, plumbing, flooring, bathrooms, and interior paint. Through the support of additional grants and donations, we were also able to renovate and update the art room (Michaels), kitchen (OCAP), and patio shade area (Union Pacific). In September 2020, our members were welcomed back to Main Branch and were thrilled with the changes and their new Club, which now serves as a testament to our founders as well as the greater Garden Grove community!
