YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS



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The Youth Development Services department serves approximately 6,800 youth daily across our school based and Club programs.

The Youth Development Leadership team ensures all programs offer enriching and impactful programs, have highly qualified and trained staff, are in compliance with local, state, and federal standards, and are meeting the community needs. The team collaborates regularly with community partners to bring additional resources to our programs. Partners include, Garden Grove Unified School District, Orange County Department of Education, California Department of Education (CDE), California Afterschool Network (CAN), Imagine Science Orange County, other local Boys & Girls Clubs, and Boys & Girls Clubs of America.

Expanded Learning Programs: BGCGG operates 44 Elementary School programs, 9 Intermediate School Programs, and 2 High School Programs located on school campuses throughout Garden Grove Unified School District. All expanded learning programs are funded through After School Education and Safety (ASES), Expanded Learning Opportunities Programs, and 21st Century Community Learning Centers grants. All school-based programs are offered at no cost to participants. Programs are open on all school days, from school dismissal until 6:00pm. Students (TK & up) must be enrolled at the school to be referred to the program. These programs are managed in partnership with Garden Grove Unified School District.



Main Branch: Our flagship location serves youth ages 5 to 18. The program operates Monday through Friday during the school year, from school dismissal to 6:00pm. During the summer and select school closure days hours expand to 7:30am-6:00pm. Main Branch is open to anyone who lives, works, or travels to the area.

Patton Branch: Our Patton Branch location is currently undergoing a facility renovation. This Club is scheduled to open in 2024 and will serve youth ages 5 to 18.

Sports Programs: Our comprehensive sports program offers participation in more than five sports, including flag football, boys and girls volleyball, basketball, soccer, and dodgeball. These organized sports leagues are offered year-round with each season scheduled for several months. Aimed at building fundamental skills, promoting teamwork, and good sportsmanship, students at all levels are encouraged to participate. Transportation is provided for players to compete against other local sports teams.

COMMUNITY HEALTH SERVICES

BOYS & GIRLS CLUBS OF GARDEN GROVE Community Health Services

Committed to the overall health and well-being of the community, Boys & Girls Clubs Community Health Services (BGC-CHS), invests in providing essential services and promotes access to mental health, family support, and health resources to youth and families in Orange County. CHS services seek to create equitable access to quality health services and resources by identifying barriers and addressing the root cause of preventing families from achieving high levels of health and wellness.



Strategies to achieve these outcomes include:

- Using a community partnerships to address youth mental health
- Engaging youth and their families in strength-based solutions
- Supporting trauma-informed approaches
- Providing culturally and linguistically competent, inclusive services and programs
- Improving the delivery and access of mental health services in non-traditional settings
- Introducing, supporting, and fostering collaboration among and between systems at the local, state, & national level

BGC-CHS provides an innovative approach to increasing access to quality health services and improving healthy outcomes for individuals and the greater community.

EARLY CHILDHOOD PROGRAMS

The first five years of a child's life are crucial to the foundation for success later in life. BGCGG has created programs in order to seize this once-in-a-lifetime learning opportunity for children and their families.



EARLY CHILDHOOD PROGRAMS

Licensed Full-Day Full-Year Preschools for children from 12 months to 5 years old. Programs provide a safe and loving environment with certified teachers who help guide learning exploration for proper development.

We believe children benefit from learning together and we serve both subsidized and fee-based families thru a blended funding model.

Community Partnerships & Quality Infant/Toddler Program Expansions

BGCGG has established many partnerships throughout the years. Since 2021, BGCGG has been providing Early Head Start Program and Services through an Early Head Start Partnership Grant with Orange County Head Start. The partnership allows us the opportunity to provide comprehensive child development and family support services to meet the needs of children and their families. The partnership enhances our overall quality including smaller group size, quality learning environment, increased staff compensation, and professional development opportunities.

BGCGG has been a part of City of Garden Grove, Neighborhood Engagement Taskforce funded by First 5 Orange County. Through this program, BGCGG strives to increase family and community engagement that supports children's school readiness and success.

Our goal is to create an Early Learning community in which there is a variety of quality early education and care options for all families.

THE CLUB EXPERIENCE

Academic Success programs ensure our members graduate on time with a plan for the future.

Power Hour: A daily program that utilizes strategies and activities to create an engaging homework help and tutoring program in an optimal study environment encouraging Club members to become self-directed learners.

STEM: Robotics, Engineering, and Science programs that engage youth and inspire them to develop a STEM mindset. Programs introduce youth to various STEM jobs and support pathways to STEM careers in the 21st Century workplace.

Exhibit of the Arts: An annual visual and performing arts showcase of youths artistic talents. Members can express themselves creatively, build confidence, and learn new skills through lessons and activities culminating in a public exhibit.



Good Character & Citizenship programs help young people develop leadership skills, a sense of civic duty, and an understanding of the value of giving back to their community.

Youth of the Year: This year-round program recognizes youth who display service to the Club and community; academic success; strong moral character; life goals; and poise and public speaking. Club members are selected for recognition monthly during the school year. Finalists from each program site are honored at the Youth of the Year award ceremony each spring.

Torch Club and Keystone: Leadership development programs at the intermediate and high school level provide opportunities for young people ages 13-18 to participate in activities in three areas: academic success, career preparation, and community service.

Healthy Lifestyle programs develop young people's capacity to engage in positive behaviors that nurture their well-being and support a lifelong commitment to healthy choices.

Sports and Recreation: These programs help youth develop a positive use of leisure time, reduction of stress, appreciation for body movement, and social and interpersonal skills.

Social Emotional Learning: SEL programs support emotional development, positive self-image, and resiliency. Activities provide youth with opportunities to make responsible decisions, prioritize mental well-being, and regulate emotions.




HOPE STUDIOS




