2022 was a year of recovery, discovery, and growth at BGCGG! Over the past year, we worked hand-in-hand with our dedicated partners to continue to rise to the challenges facing today's young people and their families. We focused on expanding access to our safe and uplifting programs and services for our members. clients, and their families. To meet a historic increase in enrollment and attendance by those served through our school-aged, early-learning, and community health programs, we hired an additional 150 team members in 2022. This growth resulted in the organization serving more youth and families than

ever before. We closed out the calendar year seeing nearly 6,800 members daily and serving over 11,000 families with case management, counseling, vision care, and mental health services. The past year has been filled with impactful partnerships that have strengthened our programs and services and provided priceless opportunities to learn and grow productively while enhancing the Club and family experience in every aspect of the organization.

A well-known saying reads, "It takes a village to raise a child." As you will see throughout this year's 2023 Impact Report and the stories shared throughout, we have been able to press forward as a team mainly due to these very partnerships and our ability to

work together to meet the rapidly evolving needs of our community and its young people. The strength of these relationships is felt throughout Garden Grove and now Orange County. We are incredibly grateful for all the support received this past year from our partners in the public, civic, corporate, and individual sectors. Together we are meeting the needs of thousands of community members each day and doing so in a way where

Financials

This past year marked a pivotal time financially for the organization as we successfully transitioned back into expanding the reach of our daily programs and services in a postpandemic world. Our recent growth has been driven by increased demand for expanded and early learning programs and a growing need for community health services. Additionally, the past twelve months marked an extraordinary year in support and contributions, thanks to significant investments into our

long-term work and sustainability. As in the past, we are proud to share those eighty-four cents of each dollar the organization expensed went directly into our programs and front-line services working with our members and families. Our youth and families will indeed feel the outcome of these financial investments for years to come and allow our vital programs and services to be a part of the greater Garden Grove community for future generations.

Finding the Root Cause – TRC

Today Robert is more confident, succeeding academically, and feels supported at school and at home.

Robert was missing a lot of school before he was referred to BGCGG's Truancy Mediation program by his school district. His first session was one of discovery. We worked with him and his family to find the root cause.



We discovered that Robert lived with a single parent who struggled just to make a living. Paying rent, providing food, and giving each family member a warm bed to sleep in was a daily challenge. We were able to start working on a strategy to connect the family to resources they needed most. After several months, Robert's family is on track to a better life because of the collaboration of the school district, Family Resource Center for housing,

OC Ready for job connections, and Truancy Mediation that provided resources that matched their needs. Robert is thriving in school and excited about the future. He was transferred to his school of choice after attendance started to improve!

Through our partnerships with the Orange County Department of Education and the District Attorney's office, Boys & Girls Clubs of Garden Grove's Truancy Mediation are working to decrease chronic absenteeism by identifying and eliminating barriers that cause truancy.

By identifying the barriers, we can improve mental health symptoms/behaviors, find housing, provide basic needs, and identify goals/root causes that the family is experiencing. As we continue to grow this collaboration, and we connect families to resources, the school district benefits as they have a new resource that can help other families in their district. Removing barriers, finding



resources, and matching needs is crucial in reducing truancy in school.

There are additional community partnerships that help us throughout the mediation process; including the Chick-Fil-A meal card incentive program, Bicycle Tree who donates bikes and helmets, Community Family Resource Centers, and on campus prevention and education programs.

Together we are positively impacting thousands of students each year and helping them reach their life goals.

"Irvine Unified School District's relationship with Boys & Girls Clubs of Garden Grove's Truancy Mediation has had a positive impact on reducing absenteeism and promoting school attendance, which in turn has had a positive impact on our students' mental health and academic achievement. By addressing truancy early and proactively, together we can promote a positive school culture and help students succeed academically and personally."

BGCGG opened the doors to our first preschool (Family Campus Preschool) in 2000. offering childcare services for children from 18 months to 5 years of age. In October 2021, we were awarded an Early Head Start Partnership Grant through Orange County Head Start to open our newest Infant License center, Clinton Corner, to serve children under three years old. This unique partnership enhances and supports an opportunity to provide comprehensive early learning and education

services and continuous services for low-income infants, toddlers, and their families. The services include education and child development, family and community engagement, and pediatric health. The Early Head Start Partnership Grant provided the resources to promote early intervention and support services for children with special needs and challenging behaviors. The low teacher-to-child ratios allow for more oneon-one interactions, which creates a high-quality,

relationship-based learning environment. The program has more access to professional development opportunities for teachers and research-based resources for program management and fiscal operation. The program also supports the development of infants and toddlers through strong partnerships with parents. It prepares children for the transition into Head Start and other preschool programs in the community.

We are proud of being the first EHS partnership site in Orange County. The partnership allowed us to increase the quality of care to support better outcomes for the nation's most vulnerable children.

Our teachers have been providing high-quality infant/ toddler care firmly grounded in the cultural, linguistic, and social needs of the families that live and work in our communities.

For more than 27 years, Garden Grove Unified School District and Boys & Girls Clubs of Garden Grove have worked together in partnership to provide numerous programs and services, both in an after-school setting, and throughout the community as a whole. We thank GGUSD for their partnership and support over the years to better serve the children and families in our community.





Ten years ago, Dreams for Schools presented Boys & Girls Clubs of Garden Grove with an innovative STEM opportunity: AppJam+. Through this computer science program, Club members are partnered with college mentors to build a mobile app in 8-10 weeks, teaching them all about STEM and exposing them to careers in technology. Over the years, hundreds of youth

have participated in AppJam+ and our collaboration has grown to include STEAM programming for kindergarten through eighth grade. Dreams for Schools provided virtual STEM classes for elementary youth when we pivoted our programs to virtual learning. This organization continues to innovate and bring new opportunities to our Club members. This year we have partnered to pilot a new STEAM Forward Initiative that brings all the components of science. technology, engineering, art, and mathematics to life in a pipeline approach to sustain youth engagement and deepen learning.

Our Dreams for Schools partnership has connected BGCGG to other agencies that align with our mission. Karina's Backpack Project, by Joy of Sharing, is a teen-led initiative to provide back-to-school supplies to thousands of youth in Orange County. In July, Karina's Backpack Project teamed up with our Community Impact Programs at the Community Health Fair to distribute 200 backpacks filled with school supplies. In December, Karina's Backpack Project provided over 500 gifts to youth in our after-school programs.

We're grateful for this incredible organization and excited to see what's next for our partnership!



Short Term Side Effects



Family & Youth Outreach Program (FYOP)

We celebrate 30 years of providing prevention and intervention services in collaboration with the Garden Grove Police Department, Garden Grove Unified School District, and the City of Garden Grove. This program has served nearly 30,000 youth and families since 1994 and continues to help thousands of young people and their families annually with services that are, in many cases, life-saving. FYOP has effectively produced outcomes that have lowered dropout and juvenile crime rates, helped

families survive crises through counseling, and saved taxpayers hundreds of thousands of dollars annually through intervention instead of juvenile detention and court proceedings. The programs include individual, group, and family counseling, drug awareness classes, juvenile offender classes, anger management, and community beautification projects that help youth under 18 get back on track. Intervention programs help youth understand how their choices affect them and everyone in their immediate

circle. In 2009, we expanded our counseling services to schools in the Garden Grove Unified School District. Through our School-Based Counseling Program, we give young people alternate pathways, connect them to family and mental health

services, and provide trusted and experienced counselors on school campuses, eliminating barriers to accessing care and allowing youth a safe place to share their feelings.

Reduce Your Capital Gains Tax! See combined tax savings of up to 70% of your gift, when you donate appreciated stocks or mutual funds. Donating appreciated assets avoids federal capital gains taxes and provides a federal income tax deduction for the current market value of the gift. Similar state tax benefits are also provided in most of the country.
